I cannot tell you how great it was to be here this week! The class has worked very hard and completed a great amount of work and learned many of the online tools we will be using this year. There is more to learn, but the basics are starting to fall into place.

Next week we continue with much of the same material, but more technology will be coming online with the class. We actually switched on the go today...the rain drowned a plan to launch paper airplanes, so instead we learned how to capture images with the chromebook camera of our journals, crop the images and attach them to Google Classroom and turn in. It was a fun technology lesson that I was very pleased with the results.

Another fun lesson was during the storm. I shared a quick science lesson on sferics.

https://theinspireproject.org/default.asp?contentID=4 This is an interesting look at natural radio signals caused by lightning strikes. The immense charge sends radio signals into the atmosphere. I happen to have one of the early Inspire radios and we listened to the cracks and pops that many would call static...but when you listen carefully you can identify as sferics caused from lightning. You can still emulate this if you listen to AM radio during a big lightning storm. The lower bandwidth can pick up the cracks and pops. It was a teachable moment that doesn't come along often...but now the class is jazzed up about the next big lightning storm. They want another storm that is more dynamic and will produce other sferic sounds..."tweaks" or "Whistlers"...

I worked last night on the recorded parent meeting presentation. You should have in your email, along with this newsletter, a copy of the Youtube link for my parent presentation. I send this so you can view it at your leisure. I will be coordinating a time next week for a parent Q&A Zoom meeting.
