

1. Create your Google Slides presentation/stop motion slides/frames
2. Goto “File” and select “Publish to the Web”

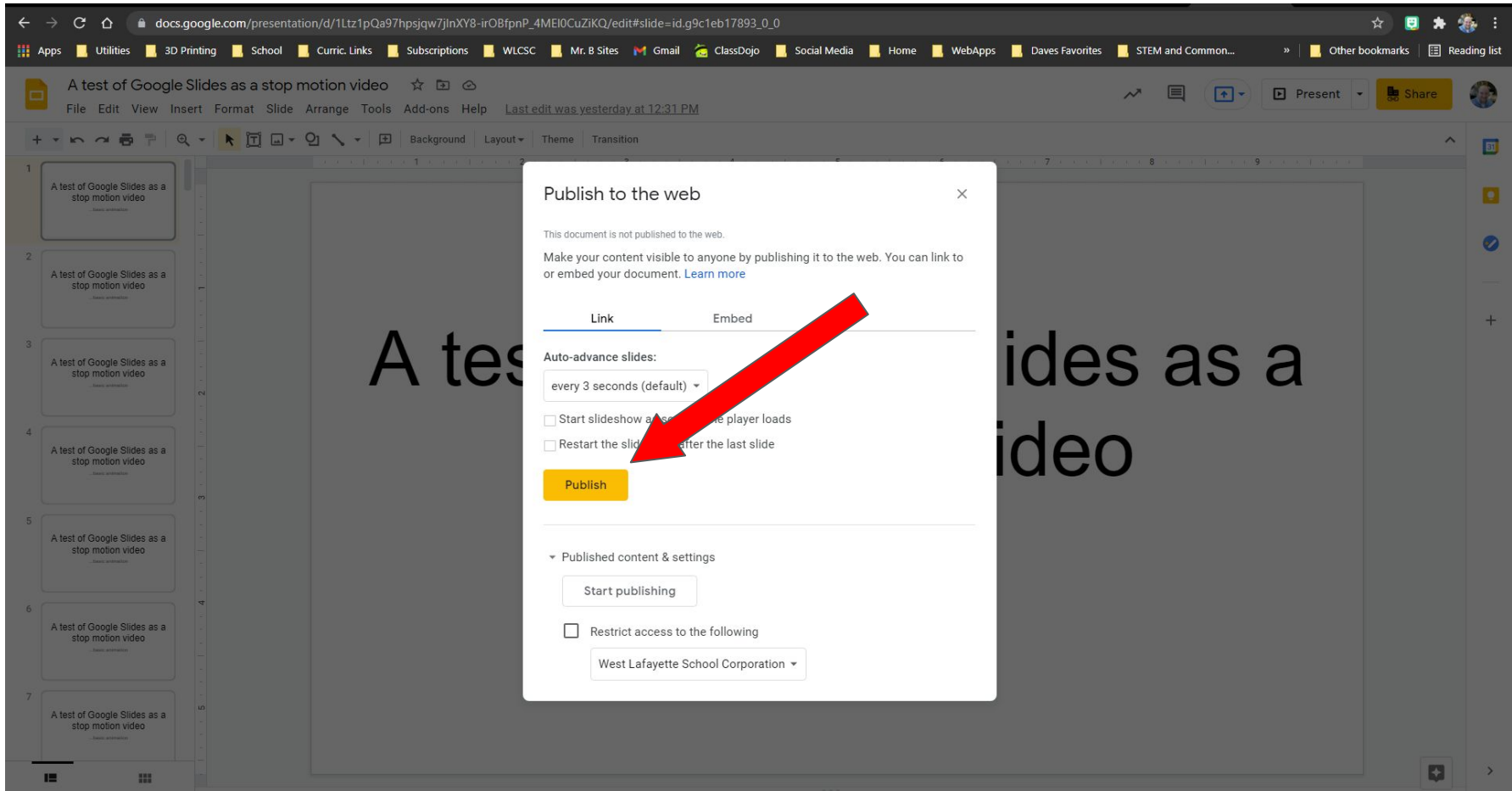

1. In the “Publish to the Web” you need to select the “PUBLISH” button (yellow).



1. You will need to confirm the publishing:

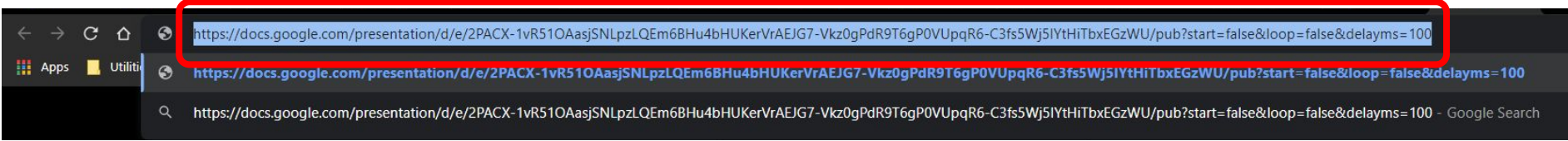

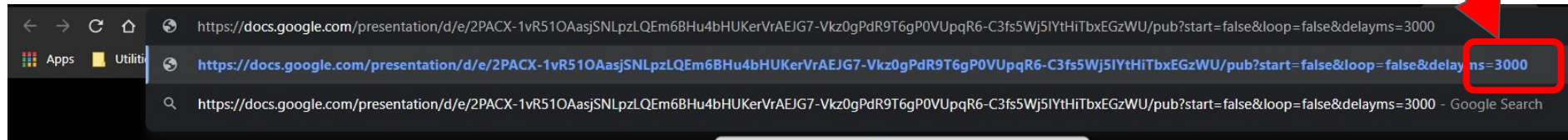

1. “CTRL+V” in the browser URL at top...then you will need to make some changes.



2. Change the “3000” at the end to 100 or 150...this will adjust the speed from 3 secs to a fraction of a second. THIS increases the speed so that the frames flip quicker...upping the frame rate.



1. Clicking “Enter” now will take you to the published slideshow. From here you will need to go to the “Auto Play” to get the stop motion to play at the assigned frame/slide rate:
